Someday Melissa - Documentary Screening



When 19-year-old Melissa Avrin lost her five year battle with bulimia on May 6, 2009, her mother, Judy Avrin, became a crusader. Determined to do all she could to raise awareness of eating disorders (ED), address the importance of early diagnosis and treatment, and to help break through the wall of secrecy and shame surrounding bulimia in particular, Judy began speaking out.

The film chronicles the journey Melissa and her family took in dealing with the disease, from her happy childhood, early diagnosis, through her treatment and to her untimely death. The Avrin family, Melissa's friends and fellow sufferers as well as top health care providers are featured in the film to offer their perspective of the condition and give better understanding of the recovery process and the seriousness of this misunderstood condition. The road to recovery is challenging, but there is hope especially when early treatment is received.
